Dear Rachel,

A couple of weeks ago I attended the "Phragmites karka – a challenge for everyone" event organized by the Awahuri Forest Kitchener Park Trust in collaboration with NZ Landcare Trust/Ngā Matapopore Whenua. This event highlighted the very serious threat P. karka poses for the Manawatu-Whanganui region and further afield. What Bessie Nichols, Aaron Madden and the team are doing in Awahuri Forest Kitchener to try and control this highly invasive exotic weeds is impressive. It must be one of the more difficult exotic weeds to control but by using a systematic approach informed by some well thought out and documented trials they are now having some success killing it.

While the 'snip and drip' method they have pioneered is very labour intensive, it does work. That contrasts with the cutting and spraying methods that have been used by Auckland Council over a period of 14 years without making any headway in controlling this weed. Realising the need for a more cost-effective method to control this weed they have trialled other methods with at least one looking quite promising. But what really struck me was the attention to detail, such as the observation by one member of the team that spraying regrowth before the new shoot emerges from the sheath is very effective.

I have followed the work of Bessie and the team since 2021 when we met at a Manawatū River Source to Sea meeting organized by the Environmental Network Manawatu. I have offered advice and support where I could, visited Awahuri Forest Kitchener Park several times and have followed with interest what they have been doing. While their principal goal is to try and eradicate it from the park that will ultimately be unsuccessful unless it is also eradicated at the source, which is further upstream around the town of Feilding. At the event of 25th March I was horrified to learn that since 2015 P. karka has spread from a stretch of 3.2 km to ~30 km down the Makino River. It is in the Oroua river and now popping up along the coast, as a consequence of flood movement. Unchecked it will continue to make its way downstream into the Manawatū and eventually into the Foxton Estuary, which is a wetland of national significance with Ramsar status.

Despite the threat it poses to the integrity of the stopbanks and the biodiversity of our region there seems to have been next to no action in the field to control it other than what the Awahuri Forest Kitchener Park Trust team are doing. To make matters worse it is still not listed on the Regional Pest Management Plan by Horizons or on the national pest list by Ministry of Primary Industries. Interestingly, P. australis is on the list of both organisations, being listed under the 'Exclusion' category in the Regional Pest Management Plan. It seems this taxonomic anomaly has created the absurd situation where one species is listed as nationally important and the other totally ignored. This is officialdom at its worst. Everyone I have spoken to within the weed group at Horizons seems to make the excuse that the Regional Pest Management Plan cannot be changed. But that is not true. Auckland Regional Council used their discretionary powers to add P. karka to their pest management plant in the 'Eradication' category. I assume Horizons can do the same. Even if there currently are not the resources to control this weed at least get it on the list so there is increased public awareness and some control even if it is under the category of 'Progressive Containment'.

I gather it was first introduced to the region to stabilize the banks of the Whangaehu River. In retrospect that was a terrible decision as one of the major concerns by the Horizon's river engineering group is destabilization of the stop banks by this exotic weed. Since that initial introduction it has spread extensively along the Whangaehu, lower Rangitikei and elsewhere i.e. it has totally got away. However, that is not a reason for ongoing inaction as highlighted by the Parliamentary Commissioner for the Environment in his 2021 Space Invaders report on exotic weeds in New Zealand.

I write to urge you to:

- Use your discretionary powers to add P. karka to the Regional Pest Management Plan.
- Ask MPI to put P. karka on the National Plant Pest List.
- Continue to provide support to the Awahuri Forest Kitchener Park Trust for the ongoing P. karka herbicide trials and removal from the park.
- Work with MPI to establish an online surveillance portal for recording sightings of P. karka (Note: establishing a real time portal for exotic weeds for New Zealand was a key recommendation by the PCE in the Space Invaders report but to date no action has been taken by MPI).
- Establish networks with community groups that are willing to carry out surveillance and removal of P. karka in the Manawatu-Whanganui region. Encourage them to post on the citizen science site, iNaturalist.
- Require that the plant pest group within Horizons play a much more active role in controlling the spread of P. karka in our region.
- Increase public awareness and education of the seriousness of this plant pest in the Manawatu-Whanganui region.

At the event of 25th March I was horrified to learn that since 2015 *P. karka* has spread from a stretch of 3.2 km to ~30 km down the Makino River. It is in the Oroua river and now popping up along the coast, as a consequence of flood movement. Unchecked it will continue to make its way downstream into the Manawatū and eventually into the Foxton Estuary, which is a wetland of national significance with Ramsar status.

Despite the threat it poses to the integrity of the stopbanks and the biodiversity of our region there seems to have been next to no action in the field to control it other than what the Awahuri Forest Kitchener Park Trust team are doing. To make matters worse it is still not listed on the Regional Pest Management Plan by Horizons or on the national pest list by Ministry of Primary Industries. Interestingly, *P. australis* is on the list of both organisations, being listed under the ‘Exclusion’ category in the Regional Pest Management Plan. It seems this taxonomic anomaly has created the absurd situation where one species is listed as nationally important and the other totally ignored. This is officialdom at its worst. Everyone I have spoken to within the weed group at Horizons seems to make the excuse that the Regional Pest Management Plan cannot be changed. But that is not true. Auckland Regional Council used their discretionary powers to add *P. karka* to their pest management plan in the ‘Eradication’ category. I assume Horizons can do the same. Even if there

currently are not the resources to control this weed at least get it on the list so there is increased public awareness and some control even if it is under the category of 'Progressive Containment'.

I gather it was first introduced to the region to stabilize the banks of the Whangaehu River. In retrospect that was a terrible decision as one of the major concerns by the Horizon's river engineering group is destabilization of the stop banks by this exotic weed. Since that initial introduction it has spread extensively along the Whangaehu, lower Rangitikei and elsewhere i.e. it has totally got away. However, that is not a reason for ongoing inaction as highlighted by the Parliamentary Commissioner for the Environment in his 2021 *Space Invaders* report on exotic weeds in New Zealand.

I write to urge you to:

- Use your discretionary powers to add *P. karka* to the Regional Pest Management Plan.
- Ask MPI to put *P. karka* on the National Plant Pest List.
- Continue to provide support to the Awahuri Forest Kitchener Park Trust for the ongoing *P. karka* herbicide trials and removal from the park.
- Work with MPI to establish an online surveillance portal for recording sightings of *P. karka* (**Note:** establishing a real time portal for exotic weeds for New Zealand was a key recommendation by the PCE in the *Space Invaders* report but to date no action has been taken by MPI¹).
- Establish networks with community groups that are willing to carry out surveillance and removal of *P. karka* in the Manawatu-Whanganui region. Encourage them to post on the citizen science site, iNaturalist.
- Require that the plant pest group within Horizons play a much more active role in controlling the spread of *P. karka* in our region.
- Increase public awareness and education of the seriousness of this plant pest in the Manawatu-Whanganui region.

- Review of all paper roads with a view to open them for Cycleway, Walkway and Bridleway use
- Use equestrian friendly language in all radio and newspaper communication for on and off road, inclusive language when discussing trails and open spaces. Safety messaging regarding driving past horse and carriage riders in road safety campaigns.
- Work with Kapiti Coast District council on linking to their CWB master plan that has links to Horowhenua in Manakau both on the Expressway track and in the hills.
- Promotion and support of Bridleways within and outside of the district, plan links with Kapiti Cycleway Walkway Bridleway network both on and off the Expressway, and plan links to the Manawatu trails planned from Palmerston north to Himatangi rail trail. Engage with the rail trail trust to see how links can be established for all users from the end of the O2NL shared path north to Palmerston North and then over to the Wairarapa on the new Manawatu gorge replacement road.
- Promote and encourage the establishment and/or extension of equestrian related business
