Support from Whanganui Search and Rescue for the Land Search and Rescue NZ submission to the Horizons Regional Council Long-Term Plan 2024-34. By Horizons providing financial support to the seven Land Search and Rescue groups in the Horizons region. With the purpose for assistance with equipment, training and other operational expenses over and above what the national organisation can currently provide.

When we get a callout, Whanganui Land Search and Rescue volunteers, alongside members of the other six Land Search and Rescue groups within the Horizons region leave their workplaces, families, and social lives to respond. We assist the lost, missing, and injured across the Horizons region and pride ourselves on being "everywhere for everyone". We don't discriminate against any persons or situations, as long as it falls within our areas of expertise so that our volunteers can also return home safely.

Our Whanganui volunteers collectively commit hundreds of hours a year to attend both nationally run and monthly local training sessions to ensure we are best skilled to serve our community in our local environments. In the past 12 months alone, we have participated in searches across the Horizons region ranging from farmland to backcountry bush to urban environments to coastline in a whole spectrum of scenarios (lost tramper, injured hunter, body recovery, lost diver, missing elderly person).

There are a lot of costs associated with keeping our members fully equipped and providing operational and administrative support so we can run a professional and effective group. For example, hiring a training space, providing reimbursements for volunteers to attend trainings and important meetings that are not funded, equipment for administration. While we do receive national funding, this does not cover all our expenses, and we strongly feel that lack of individual financial resources should not be a barrier for volunteering for Land Search and Rescue.

Thus, we would like to ask the community that we serve to help support us - we really do fill a gap in our region that could not be easily or effectively filled by other agencies. A financial contribution from the Horizons Regional Council would help to provide us with additional financial support and security so we can ensure that we can continue to offer our best services to our community.

There is an acknowledgement that Horizons Regional Council faces many challenges in a post Covid environment. A modest contribution from ratepayers will support the efforts of community-based emergency services volunteers, it will support the provision of a safety net and continue to generate positive and tangible benefits for our communities, residents and visitors.

Ten Year Plan 2024 – 2034

The following are my comments regarding your Ten Year Plan.

Bus Service

Prior to 2017 the Government GPS policy on subsidies was that one had to prove that the public Transport method would reduce congestion on the roads. In 2017 the Labour Government changed the policy of proof, to opening the flood gates. The new National lead Government GPS policy has removed all subsidies for Public transport, footpaths and cycle ways.

The bus service in Wanganui has done the exact opposite to what one would expect and added to the congestion on the roads and air pollution.

Both HRC and the Whanganui District Council are promoting a new high speed more frequent service (Option 1) in the HRC long term planning document. That comes at a considuable cost ref appendix 1 attached.

The transport levy for my property would change:

- from	\$57.68	2024
- to	\$222.28	2027

A property on **St John Hill** with a capital value of \$1.750,000:

Ten Year Plan 2024 – 2034

The following are my comments regarding your Ten Year Plan.

Bus Service

Prior to 2017 the Government GPS policy on subsidies was that one had to prove that the public Transport method would reduce congestion on the roads. In 2017 the Labour Government changed the policy of proof, to opening the flood gates. The new National lead Government GPS policy has removed all subsidies for Public transport, footpaths and cycle ways.

The bus service in Wanganui has done the exact opposite to what one would expect and added to the congestion on the roads and air pollution.

Both HRC and the Whanganui District Council are promoting a new high speed more frequent service (Option 1) in the HRC long term planning document. That comes at a considuable cost ref appendix 1 attached.

The transport levy **for my** property would change:

- from	\$57.68	2024
- to	\$222.28	2027

A property on St John Hill with a capital value of \$1.750,000:

-from	\$190.40	2024
- to	\$733.95	2027

These charges high light the need to change the Passenger Services Levy from a \$100,000 capital value to a UAGC (per house hold or Uniform Annual General Charge.)

The HRC Transport recovery policy is 50/25/25 That is 50% Central Government (LTNZ subsidy) 25% HRC (Rates) 25% Passenger fares

2. Membership of Local Government NZ (LGNZ)

I suggest that your membership be terminated immediately. It has been reported to me that it spreads Racist and misleading information. There is no place for this behaviour in our multicultural society. At a recent meeting a member left early because of this behaviour. The savings would be \$50,000pa plus.

3. Loan Facility

Your loan facility of \$71.2m needs to be capped then reduced ASAP A serious review of all expenditure needs to take place removing all non core business expenditure. ie:

a. Te Reo translation services

95% of the population does not understand the language and cannot speak it. Therefore the whole exercise is a total waste of money.

b. Any planned holiday by the Chairperson on the Rate Payers needs to be cancelled. ie Wellington, Lower Hutt & Wanganui

4. Te Reo Translations Services

I believe this Division of HRC should be disestablished as 95% of the Rate Payers cannot read it or understand it and therefore become confused and irritated. That is the reason why Labour lost the last election.

5. Bushy Park

The proposed increase in the annual grant from \$20,000 to \$50,000 per year is excessive in a time of financial constraint. I believe it should remain at \$20,000

6. Iwi Consultation Payments

As there does not appear to be a separate Ledger Accounting code and no entry in the Annual Account statements, there appears to be an attempt at concealing those payments.

Anyone asking questions are actively discouraged and told, it is not appropriate to ask questions relating to the subject. **Ref appendix 3 attached**

As the Rate payers have neither been consulted nor asked to approve these payments there is something wrong.

A ruling by the Auditor General is now needed to say if the payments are in fact legal.

If the payments are illegal those involved in the authorizing and payment need to be charged with misappropriation of funds.

Those receiving those funds could also be charged.
